Internet Use Policy Agreement

Princeton Public library is pleased to make information resources available to its staff and patrons through the Internet. We make this service available as part of our mission to make valuable information sources democratically accessible.

The Internet poses significant challenges as an information resource. The library cannot monitor or control the content of the Internet. You may find some sites controversial or inappropriate. Internet sites should be evaluated regularly for their content, accuracy, and availability. Users are encouraged to take advantage of the vast body of information on the Internet, but to exercise good judgment and discretion.

Use of library-provided internet access is a privilege, not a right; inappropriate use will result in cancellation of this privilege. Examples of inappropriate use include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Violation of computer system integrity
- Unauthorized tampering with computer hardware or software
- Storage of data to anything other than a personal storage device
- Violation of software license agreements and copyright laws
- Violation of another user's privacy

Illegal acts involving library computing resources may also be subject to prosecution by local, State or Federal authorities.

The library's staff will assist patrons with Internet use as time permits but cannot offer personal instruction. Staff is always available to locate books, periodicals and other sources describing the Internet and its uses.

As with all other library materials, restriction of a child's access to the Internet is the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian.

The library behavioral policies apply to use of the Internet.
