friendship strong enough to move past this crime?



#### "The Mayor of Idyllwild" by Riley Mandell and Ben Bailey Documentary; 13 minutes, 25 seconds

When the small town of Idyllwild, California, decided to elect an animal as their mayor, most viewed it as a joke, but one family saw it as their chance to make a difference in the community.
